MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING – NURSING EDUCATION

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The program is designed for registered nurses who hold a bachelor's degree and who wish to earn a Master of Science in Nursing degree. To be considered for admission applicants must have the following:

- 1. Baccalaureate degree from a postsecondary educational institution accredited by an agency recognized by the United States Department of Education, or an equivalent degree from a comparable foreign institution
 - 1. Evidence, in the form of official transcripts, of conferral of bachelor's degree; or
 - 2. For international students, an official transcript translation and evaluation from a member of the Association of International Credentials Evaluators (AICE) or the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES)
- 2. Current registered nurse license in good standing from any state, territory, or district in the United States. This requirement does not apply to international students.

TRANSFER CREDIT

Residency Requirement: No more than 9 of the 36 credits required for the Master of Science in Nursing can be met through transfer credit.
